Focus Groups

2024 has been an exciting year for our small groups. At the beginning of the year we saw the need to invest more in our small

I have started writing bible studies for the groups to deepen their faith, which has been appreciated. Children's ministry

We look back at 2024 in the Children's church as a year of growth. We have welcomed new people in leadership and the children's groups. Two Sundays in the fall semester we have served hot dogs to families after the service. As a finale to the semester we had a family service on the third of advent, focusing on the message of christmas, which was followed by a christmas party for more fellowship.

We are thankful that God continues to meet our children and that we get the possibility to speak the word of God into their lives week after week. We long for the children to have a natural and personal relationship with God and get to discover their gifts they have been given through the Holy Spirit. Pray with us for this to happen!

Grow

In January 2024, we went from having 3 active leaders to 7 at Grow! This made it possible for us to start having Grow every week instead of every other week, as in previous years. In 2024 we have seen so much joy and fellowship flourish in our young adult group. We have seen people that long to meet, share life and grow in their relationship with Jesus.



Café Liv och LP

We are happy and thankful for growth and the shift between generations that we see, with young active people from different nationalities joining the team, now 20-25 people. Ibios students are also participating in the work in a good way, and the cooking team has made soup under the leadership of our amazing cook Sebastian. We see a development from our discipleship training on Wednesdays, as multiple people from the team have started to preach and give testimonies at Café Liv, and the conversations at the tables have developed well. The team is led by Daniel Simonsson, Pekka Liljeblom, Mervi Liljeblom and Lovisa and Martin Ström. Teaching in the ways of God's kingdom has been shared with the team throughout the year. Worship leaders and evangelists from City Church and other churches around Stockholm have visited the gatherings under the leadership of Eva Gustin.

Thousands of meals have been served to our guests, and many have been given clothes. Around the tables people have had a lot of good conversations and we are grateful to see over 20 nationalities gather at Café Liv. We have focused our direction on reaching out to new groups of people, not only homeless. Now we have guests that are poor pensioners, beggars, undocumented people and people living with mental health issues visiting the Café Liv gatherings with preaching, worship and intercession every Wednesday. Many have received Jesus as their lord and savior and we are glad

to see that we for the first time have held communion together with our guests and team at the autumn fest in October.

This year, we've witnessed tremendous growth. The addition of new children and sponsors expanded our family to 111 students, each progressing academically and personally. Despite facing challenges, including a "red eyes" outbreak in all schools in earlier on, the resilience of our students shone through, and by the year's end, over 70% had shown marked improvement in their performance. Witnessing this success has reminded me of the transformative power of faith, community, and a dedicated team.

Definitely, the highlight of the year would have to be our successful SOHA Youth Camp in September. With well-attended sessions on personal growth, skill building, and purposeful living, the camp was a place where true connection, learning, and thriving happened for our children. Their enthusiasm and engagement were true testaments to the program's mandate to identify, inspire and influence vulnerable children and orphans towards holistic transformation.

Our commitment to reaching each child went beyond the classroom into home visits, making sure that every child felt seen, supported, and valued. We also saw

Just Earth Uganda

The agricultural sector is the backbone of Uganda, providing livelihoods for millions of people countrywide. However, farmers face numerous challenges, but mainly limited access to knowledge, resources, and technology. Training programs such as Just Earth Uganda's Farmer Field Sch has emerged as a vital tool to bridge this gap. Empowering farmers to improve their productivity, income, and quality of life which has led to community transformation in Rakai and Bukomansimbi districts of Uganda.

Practical Demonstrations during every lesson at the Farmer Field Sch, ensures hands-on training for tangible understanding.

Mentorship Programs where facilitators keep guiding the farmers at their individual farms as they run through the course of study. Farmer-to-farmer knowledge sharing has changed the face of gardens in these farming communities including the community members who have not been directly involved in the Farmer Field Schools.

Effective training programs in Farmer Field Sch focus on:

- Kingdom life course

- Crop management and soil conservation
- Irrigation and water management
- Integrated soil fertility and pest management
- Environmental and Natural resource Management for climate change adaptation

The community appreciates the power of Training by Just Earth Uganda.

Pakistan

With a focus on education, practical help and spiritual care, Asma med Care Community Center has been there for those who need it most.
