Focus Groups

When I look back at 2025 it is with deep gratitude to God for all He has done through the Focus Groups. The ministry has two parts: the groups that meet in homes around Stockholm and our open Monday group at church with fika, bible study, conversations, prayer and fellowship.

During the year there has been a clear development, primarily regarding the Mondays. The number of attendees has increased dramatically compared to the year before, especially during the fall semester. The number has nearly increased threefold compared to 2024, and in December we finished the year with an average of 42 attendees every gathering.

What I am most grateful for is the spiritual fruit that has come from the ministry. Many attendees have shared the positive effects in their relationships with God. In the latest survey 93% of attendees answered that the Focus groups have helped them in living as disciples of Jesus and deepen their relationship with God. This is something I am very happy about and is to a large extent a result of our own material and questions made to help people grow in discipleship. In the fall we started "After Alpha", a Focus group for those who have recently completed the Alpha course. In December 16 people participated together, using an adapted version of the material to get started with reading the Bible, understanding discipleship and nurturing the relationships that have formed during Alpha.

I am so thankful for what God has done in the Focus groups. His mercy has been with us throughout 2025, and I am excited to see what He will do in 2026.

CKS Children's ministry

Café liv, Café hopp & LP City

We are happy and thankful for the growth with new team members and leaders that have joined over the past year, and for the shift happening between generations that we can see: young, energized leaders from different nationalities are joining the team. The leadership team consists of Pekka and Mervi Liljeblom, Daniel Simonsson, Eva Gustin and our new leaders are Sara Holmberg as well as Lene and David Fhager.

The IBIOS students have participated well and the kitchen team have made soup under the leadership of our new chef Lene Fhager. We see development from the leader/disciple teaching from Wednesdays, and more people have started preaching and giving testimonies at Café Liv, and the conversations are developing well. The teaching on the values of God's kingdom has been shared with the team over the year. Worshippers and evangelists from CKS, as well as other churches in Stockholm have been a great joy and blessing for the ministry.

Several thousand meals have been served to our guests and many have received clothes. Many enriching conversations have been had across the tables and we are grateful to see how over 20 nationalities are represented in our services at Café liv.

We have had three parties in 2025, at the Easter Party we shared communion with all guests which was very much appreciated. We also had an Autumn Party with pumpkin soup and an incredible Christmas Party where Konditoriet was filled to the brim with guests.

The aim is to reach more people and groups, not only homeless people. Now we have guests who are pensioners, beggars, undocumented immigrants and people struggling

with their mental health visiting us as well. Every Wednesday we meet and offer worship, preaching, intercession and fellowship over the tables. Many have received Jesus Christ as their savior and we have seen multiple healings during the year.

In the Autumn we started a new evangelization project in Akalla, which we are calling Café Hopp. On the first Wednesday of each week a team of ours go to a hall we have rented in Akalla, they evangelize in the streets and invite people to services. Many visit us and many new connections have been made.

The work with addiction at CKS, LP City, has had meetings on Thursday afternoons all of 2025. We have had many good discussions in fellowship and counselling and advice, as well as gathering to listen to the Word and to pray each week.

We thank our Citykyrkan greatly for the support and prayers we have received - you really make a difference.

Marriage & Pre marriage courses

Under the Alpha umbrella there are also the Marriage and Pre-Marriage courses. The Marriage Course consists of seven nights where couples invest in their relationship and are given tools to create a strong, flourishing and lasting marriage. This year, we hosted the course for the second time starting in October, and it was attended by a lot of couples, both on site and online. Since the course material is in English with Swedish subtitles it has been easy to serve couples from both CKS and CCI with English speaking couples.

The Pre Marriage course is for couples who are entering marriage. There they can prepare, by during the 5 week course together go through subjects that helps them

build a foundation for their marriage. We had about 10 couples attend in the spring. An incredibly appreciated course!

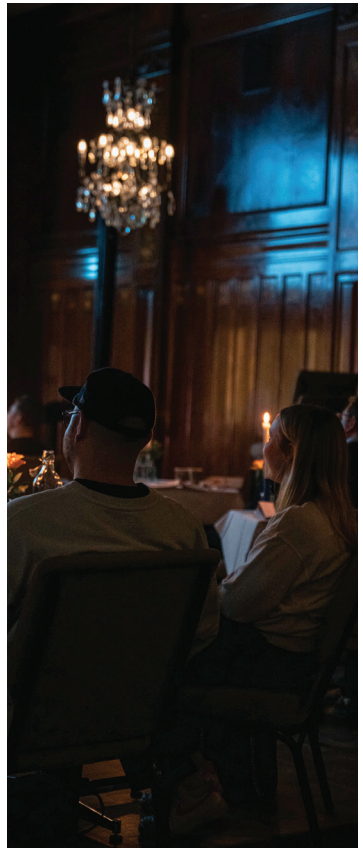

City Church Kampala

2025: A Year of Intentional Growth in God

City Church Kampala experienced God's tangible presence like never before! In 2025, we witnessed unstoppable love and growth, and we can't wait to share it with you.

We hosted the biggest Love Encounter yet, with 16 IBIOS students joining us for door-to-door evangelism in Butabika, reaching souls for Christ! Our 2-day Revival & Healing meetings with IBIOS saw God's glory sweep Kampala, leaving a lasting impact with over 500 people who turned for each service.

Our weekly Sunday services (10am-12pm) continue to fuel congregational growth in Spirit and numbers. The Monday 6-8pm prayer meetings remain the heartbeat, igniting everything we do.

The Ignite Worship Service (2nd Sundays) has birthed deeper encounters with the Holy Spirit. We're excited to see this ministry continue to flourish!

Our School of Timothy graduated 8 students in 2025 – leaders for the harvest! This is a testament to God's investment in our church family.

Children's church has grown by about 40% from 2024, posing a wonderful challenge to find a bigger meeting space for our young ones.

In a remarkable display of generosity, church members took on the responsibility of buying a generator, and we're excited to announce that the purchase is in its final stages!

As we look to 2026, we're increasing our staff and volunteers to meet the growing needs

of our church family. We're also beautifying the sanctuary, starting with a floor campaign that has already begun. Challenges remain, but WE BELIEVE GOD! Grateful for 2025, excited for what's next! City Church Kampala - where LOVE & the SPIRIT move!

Soha Smile of Hope Africa

The status at Soha at the end of 2025 is that there are 103 children enrolled in the programme. This accounts for the 6 students who have graduated in 2025. Currently there are 98 sponsors, two have needed to cancel their sponsorship in 2025 and three new have joined.

Those whose children have graduated will be asked if they wish to keep the sponsorship with a new child, or cancel their sponsorship, as they have sponsored their child to the "finish line". A few sponsors have yet to be assigned a child, this will be done early 2026. In 2025 six Soha-children graduated with certificates in the following fields: Fashion And Design, Nursing And Midwifery, Education, and Coffee Barista.

In 2025 Soha has organized:

Health Program - Medical support and provision of sanitary products to those Soha children who menstruate, so that they can go to school.

SOHA Camps - For children at the beginning of each term, and one at Christmas where they can practice shopping in stores, something many have never done before.

IBIOS bible school visited Soha in May. The students participated in activities alongside the children and got to learn about the programme. This is a part of City Church Kampala's yearly "Love Encounter".

Faith medical camp that took place in October, while outside the Soha programme, was attended by the children who had the opportunity to seek care. A couple former Soha-children who have graduated with qualifications in nursing were volunteers at the event, which was great to see. Rosa Moreno and I visited Uganda for the event and had the opportunity to visit local schools attended by the Soha-children.

Just Earth

During 2025, Just Earth Uganda carried out extensive activities through the Farmer Field Schools in Kooki and Bukomansimbi. The work was characterised by regular training in sustainable and practical farming methods, combined with fieldwork, on-farm visits providing context-specific instruction, and demonstration plots at the schools. Farmers received training in, among other areas, crop management, land preparation, livestock husbandry, post-harvest handling, and financial discipline through savings and credit initiatives (SACCO). The year also included graduation ceremonies, field days with strong local participation, and recurring radio-based training that reached thousands of listeners.

A clear development during the year was the continued work towards increased self-sufficiency. Activities at the dairy farm progressed through improved infrastructure, fodder preparation, and enhanced security.

During the year, an important foundation was also laid for Just Earth Uganda through targeted recruitment of new students via pre-training meetings and close collaboration with local leaders. This enabled the planning and launch of two new classes during the year, allowing more farmers to begin their training and engage with the programme within their local communities

Pakistan Community Care

In July, Asma, who runs the Community Care ministry, visited Sweden and participated in various activities at City Church. She taught at IBIOS, met with the mission council and visited the Church board. She attended various gatherings and we were so happy to be able to bring Asma here to us.

Asma and Community Care Ministry's mission during the year has included educational support, livelihood support and humanitarian aid to families in need.

An important development during the year was the opening of a coaching center that

provides regular support and opportunities for extended learning to children. When parts of Pakistan, including the area where Asma works, were affected by floods, the mission was further expanded to disaster relief work to help flood victims who were left without homes, food and clothing.

The focus and development have been partially affected in 2025. The lack of educational support for children, the economic difficulties of brick kiln families and the devastation caused by the floods led the mission to focus on education, improved livelihoods and humanitarian aid. These needs shaped the mission's priorities this year.

Bible Adventure

The Bible Adventure continues to reach out to more schools, in addition to Sundbyberg now also in the Järva area. Seventeen classes have been visited with 280 minutes of exciting Bible teaching in grades four and five.

For two years now I have been connecting with the prayer network "Hopp för Järva" which prays every Thursday morning for the area's 20 schools and also goes on prayer walks. It can be tough to talk about the Jewish people and Israel in these classes, one pupil took the kippah I showed and threw it in the dustbin. In the same class another pupil thanked me for teaching him so much.

Every school that opens for Bible Adventure has been prepared for a long time. Trust is built by me writing, calling and visiting schools to present the material, until teachers dare to trust that Bible Adventure stays within the curriculum and can welcome me. The fact that more teachers and more schools have opened for Bible Adventure lessons is a result of me spending time building contact. Teachers have a lot to think about and need to be constantly reminded of Bible Adventure, which creates interest and love for the Bible in nine-to-twelve- year-olds.

A teacher at Ursviksskolan spontaneously wrote a long review that he wanted me to send when I write to other schools. He wrote, among other things. *"Through a combination of stories, short interactive moments and theatre, the students are captured.... For teachers, this is an invaluable resource"*
